NIGHT WORKS NOTIFICATION

CONTINUED UTILITY SERVICES RELOCATION WORKS

SEPTEMBER – OCTOBER 2018

From **mid-September to mid-October**, night works to install utility services will continue on the Oaklands Grade Separation Project. This includes conduit trenching, stobie pole and cabinet installations, and the relocation of gas and water mains. The project will also undertake some concrete works for the Morphett Road bridge construction. Works will be undertaken within the rail corridor, on Dunrobin and Addison roads, Warradale, and Diagonal and Morphett roads and Murray Terrace, Oaklands Park.

The Oaklands Crossing Grade Separation Project will improve safety for all road users and ease traffic congestion by lowering the rail line under the road and removing the level crossing. The \$174.3 million project is jointly funded by the Australian Government, the South Australian Government and the City of Marion, and will be delivered by the Public Transport Projects (PTP) Alliance with the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI).

Key Activities

Night works to install gas, water and electrical services and bridge works will be undertaken, **from mid-September, between the hours of 7:00pm and 6:00am**. Respite nights will be provided throughout these works where possible. Please note that there will also be ongoing works during the day within the various project zones.

Key activities throughout the works include:

- Set up of heavy machinery (including excavators, vacuum trucks and crane trucks)
- Set up of traffic management and temporary lighting
- Concrete pouring and barrier installations
- Trenching for the relocation of gas and water mains and laying of conduits
- Pipework installation and connections
- Concrete footing, stobie pole and electrical cabinet installations
- Truck movement to transport materials and spoil
- Backfill, compaction and reinstatement of trenches.

How will these works affect me?

Night works are required to reduce impacts on traffic flow and the construction crew will make every effort to minimise noise and lighting impacts to nearby residents and businesses as much as possible.

For all works, **speed and lane restrictions and closures will continue to be in place, with traffic management located on site to advise commuters of changed traffic conditions**. Road users and pedestrians are advised to please take care and observe traffic signage when travelling through the area, and traffic controllers will be on site to assist. Where possible, works that may cause further traffic delays will be undertaken outside peak hours and during weekends.
