



## OAKLANDS CROSSING GRADE SEPARATION

### NIGHT WORKS AND TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS NOTIFICATION

#### MARCH - APRIL

Throughout March and April, night works will continue on the Oaklands Crossing Grade Separation project. Work activity will take place within the rail corridor, on Dunrobin, Morphett, Addison and Diagonal Roads, and Murray, Crozier and Railway Terraces. Truck haulage will continue in Addison Road, Struan Avenue, Crozier Terrace and Diagonal Way, with some intermittent diversions to provide respite to residents.

**A reminder to motorists that speed and lane restrictions will continue to be in place with traffic management located on site to advise commuters of changes to traffic conditions. Further information on traffic management is below.**

#### Key Activities

Night works will continue **between the hours of 7pm and 6am** and respite nights will be provided throughout these works where possible. **Please note that there will also be ongoing works during the day and construction crews will be utilising stockpile locations within the various project zones during the day and night.**

Key activities and impacts throughout the works include:

- Set up of heavy machinery, traffic management and temporary lighting
- Kerb demolition, pavement widening, new kerb works and line marking
- Installation of stormwater, street lighting and aboveground infrastructure (traffic signal posts, fencing and control cabinets) on Dunrobin, Diagonal and Morphett Roads
- Hydro-vacuuming, backfilling, compaction and reinstatement of trenches
- Car park construction in Addison Road
- SA Water main installation in Morphett Road (north of the level crossing) from late April
- Truck movement to transport materials and spoil to stockpile areas.

Numerous works within the rail corridor include:

- Station formation and service installations
- Installation of rail signalling equipment
- Crane lifting and concrete pours
- Installation of gantries and overhead line equipment
- Welding and installation of rail track in the new corridor.

#### How will these works affect me?

The construction crew will make every effort to minimise noise and lighting impacts to nearby residents and businesses as much as possible. As there will also be ongoing day works in these areas, where possible, the construction crew will aim to complete the most disruptive works during the day and early evening. Please note that any works within the existing rail corridor will need to be undertaken outside train service times (during the evening).

For all works, speed and lane restrictions and closures will continue to be in place on main and local roads, with traffic management located on site to advise commuters of changed traffic conditions. Road users and pedestrians are advised to please take care and observe traffic signage when travelling through the area. Traffic controllers will be on site to assist. The project works closely with the Traffic Management Centre and where possible, works that may cause further delays will be undertaken outside of peak hours and during weekend.
